

Carron Dams

Heritage Trail

Length: 3-3.5km
Duration: 1 - 2 hours

Head outside on a walk around the historic site of Carron Ironworks, through the dams and the place where once stood the West Carron village. This is where the workers of the ironworks were housed and had developed a vibrant community. The Carron Dams trail was developed by the Hidden Heritage group of local volunteers, who spent several weeks researching the history and untold tales of the area.
